

## Clinician Educator Faculty Position Division of Hematology-Oncology Department of Pediatrics

The Department of Pediatrics at McMaster University and McMaster Children's Hospital, Hamilton Health Sciences are seeking **one full-time academic physician** to join the Division of Pediatric Hematology-Oncology. Applicants of all academic levels will be considered. Opportunity exists for experienced candidates with interest in leadership to also be considered for the role of **Division Head**.

Located in Hamilton, on the edge of Lake Ontario and the picturesque Niagara escarpment, McMaster Children's Hospital is a tertiary referral centre serving a population of more than 2.3 million. McMaster University is internationally recognized for innovations in medical education and pioneering biomedical, epidemiological and health systems research. McMaster Children's Hospital is one of the busiest children's hospitals in Ontario offering specialized care to over 150,000 children each year.

The Division of Pediatric Hematology/Oncology currently has ten physicians. The successful candidate will share responsibilities for delivering the comprehensive clinical services provided by the Division, and will participate in research and educational activities. To address the clinical needs of the Division, an area of clinical focus in solid tumour oncology would be an asset.

This position will incorporate an academic appointment, and rank and salary will be commensurate with the experience and expertise of the applicant. The Division is a research-intensive group; the successful candidate will be encouraged to participate in collaborative research and to develop a clinical investigative agenda. They will also participate in educational activities within the undergraduate medical education program and the Royal College accredited Pediatric and Pediatric Hematology/Oncology postgraduate training programs. We offer a collegial atmosphere, a unique academic environment, and the opportunity to work in a thriving academic department with enthusiastic colleagues.

Applicants should be certified (or eligible for certification) in Pediatrics and Hematology/Oncology by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and must be licensed (or eligible for licensure) in the Province of Ontario. Start date is negotiable.

All qualified applicants are encouraged to apply; however, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be considered first for this position. To comply with the Government of Canada's reporting requirements, the University is obliged to gather information about applicants' status as either Permanent Residents of Canada or Canadian citizens. Applicants need not identify their country of origin or current citizenship; however, all applications must include one of the following statements: Yes, I am a citizen or permanent resident of Canada - or - No, I am not a citizen or permanent resident of Canada.

Expressions of interest should include:

- An up-to-date curriculum vitae and cover letter
- A description of training and research experience as well as the names and addresses of three professional referees.
- A brief statement describing any contributions made or planned in relation to:

advancing equity, diversity, and inclusion, inclusive excellence in teaching, and research; service within higher education, community-based or other professional settings (2-page maximum)

Letters of reference are not required and will not be reviewed at the application stage; letters of recommendation from referees will be requested at later stages of the search process.
