



Call for Applications and Instructions

100% Fund Grant Competition Sarcoma

MANDATE

Nearly one in five children diagnosed with cancer will not survive. For children with rare and hard to treat cancers, the odds can be far worse. The **100% Fund** has been created to challenge these odds. Phoebe Rose Rocks Foundation, Fight Like Mason Foundation, Mélia's Memory, Eli's Childhood Cancer Foundation, Sarcoma Research Canada, Kindred Foundation and Childhood Cancer Canada have partnered to fund research for children and teens who do not, yet, have their cure.

The 100% Fund targets pediatric and adolescent cancers that are hard to treat—cancers that have not responded to available therapies. The goal is to fund research with the potential to deliver improved treatment and increased survival rates.

THE 100% FUND GRANT COMPETITION

Sarcoma

We will accept **one application** focused on **sarcoma** for consideration in the 2024 Round 5 grant competition.

Projects can range from discovery to clinical trials, but must be aimed at improving treatment outcomes, treatment options and/or quality of life.

The maximum amount awarded will be \$50,000 per year for 2 years (\$100,000 total maximum value).

Research Competition Process

- The 100% Fund grant competition in Sarcoma (Round 5) will be a two-stage process comprised first of a registration email indicating your intent to apply, followed by a full grant submission.
- Full grant applications, including a 4-page research proposal, will be reviewed and ranked by the C17 Research Network Committee.
- Consult the *Award and Application Guide*, available on the C17 website; not all instruction is available on the application forms.

C17 Research Network

The purpose of the C17 Research Network is to advance research with the potential to further C17's mission of improving health outcomes and quality of life for children and adolescents in Canada with cancer and blood disorders. The C17 Research Network is set up to foster collaborative, multi-disciplinary, multi-site, Canadian research in pediatric hematology, oncology, and stem cell transplantation. We encourage multi-centre collaboration, new collaborations, mentorship and applications from young investigators.

KINDRED FOUNDATION

Kindred Foundation is a Canadian charity dedicated to funding health research and programs within three pillars; 1. Childhood cancer research and clinical trials, 2. Youth mental and physical health, and 3. Community support (e.g., food security, hospice/palliative care for children and adults). To ensure sustainable giving, the Foundation is built on a solid financial endowment model with 100% of receipted donations directed towards the charitable purpose.

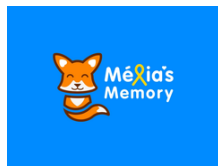
Childhood Cancer Canada

INSTRUCTIONS

- Register by email to evani.goll@c17.ca by **October 23, 2024**. Registration requires the name and email address of the Principal Investigator, and a draft project title. The registration information will not be reviewed.
- Grants submissions are due **November 20, 2024** by 4:00 pm MT.
- Please submit one (1) electronic copy of the application via email. Application, proposal, CVs, appendixes and any additional supporting documents must be assembled into a SINGLE PDF file. Applications spread over multiple files will not be accepted.
- In addition to the PDF of the application, please send a word document containing the i) project title, ii) name and contact information of the ONE Principal Investigator, iii) names and contact information any co-Investigators, iv) lay summary (max. 150-200 words) and v) scientific abstract (max. 500 words). This document is for administrative purposes, and there are no formatting requirements. Do not submit a hardcopy. Keep the original signature pages on file.
